# **Pro Tools Keyboard Shortcuts for Macintosh**

For increased operational speed and ease-of-use, there are many Pro Tools keyboard shortcuts to give you fast access to a wide variety of tasks. This guide details the many keyboard shortcuts that are not shown within Pro Tools menus. The shortcuts are grouped by functional area for your added convenience and quick reference.

#### **Conventions Used in This Guide**

Digidesign guides use the following conventions to indicate menu choices and key commands:

Convention	Action
File > Save Session	Choose Save Session from the File menu
Command+N	Hold down the Com- mand (Apple) key and press the N key
Option+"+/-"	Hold down the Option key and press the "+" or "-" key (numeric keypad or QWERTY, as noted)
Command-click	Hold down the Com- mand key and click the mouse button
